

APC ex-scribe Udoedehe secures NNPP's guber ticket in Akwa Ibom

Former Interim National Secretary of the All Progressives Congress (APC), Senator John James Udoedehe, has defected and grabbed the governorship ticket of New Nigeria Peoples Party (NNPP) in

Akwa Ibom State. Udoedehe, a founding member of APC, had failed in his bid to secure the APC's gubernatorial ticket which was said to have been won by Akan Udofia, who had earlier bought the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) governorship nomination form and reportedly scored

two votes. In a statement addressed to the ward chairman of the party in Uyo Local Government Udoedehe said his defection was a tough and painful decision.

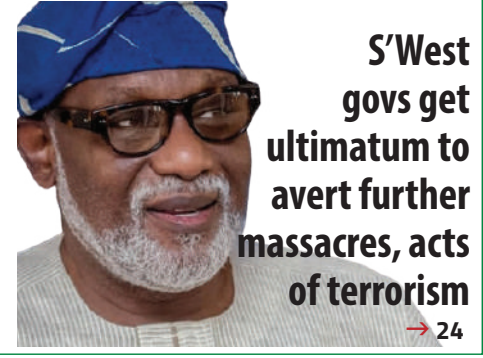

Why Tinubu performed strongly

Jagaban Borgu was on course to victory this morning after some of the aspirants stepped down for Asiwaju Bola Tinubu and asked their supporters to vote for the All Progressives Congress (APC) national leader.

They announced their withdrawal for Tinubu while addressing delegates at the APC presidential primary poll for the last time before the commencement of the election.

They are former Governor of Ogun State and serving senator, Ibikunle Amosun, ex-governor of Akwa Ibom State, Sen. Godswill Akpabio, erstwhile Speaker, House of Representatives, Dimeji Bankole, as well as Jigawa State Governor Abubakar Badaru, his Ekiti counterpart, Dr. Kayode Fayemi and Senator. Robert Ajayi Boroffice.

Announcing his stepping down for the former Lagos governor, former Speaker Dimeji Bankole said "because I like to grow old, I hereby withdraw for my elder, Tinubu."

Barrister Mrs. Uju Ohanenye also stepped down for Tinubu and urged her supporters to vote for him.

Some of the 23 aspirants refused to step down or withdraw but went ahead with the election. They were immediate past Transportation Minister, Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi, former Minister for Science and Technology, Dr. Ogbonnaya, Pastor Tunde Bakare, ex-governor of Zamfara State, Sani Yerima, and erstwhile Imo State helmsman, Owelle Rochas Okorocho.

Amaechi said he was the most experience among the aspirants.

Rather than stepping down, he challenged delegates to assess aspirants saying: "assess us by what we have done not by how much we bring here. Ask those who bring money, what is the source of your income."

Bakare said he was stepping up.

Ken Nnamani did not step down as earlier reported.

Fayemi in stepping down for Tinubu said: "Our brothers from the Northern Governors Forum of the APC have led by example by proposing to party members that the next candidate of our party and by God's grace the next president of our country must come from the Southern part of this country and I have come to a difficult but necessary decision and that decision is that we must look for the most appropriate person at this time to do the job.

"I am prepared to sacrifice my ambition to be president of Nigeria. I am a young man and I still have a lot of time ahead of me and one person I have worked with in the trenches of democratic struggles and in the cause of governing Nigeria side by side, shoulder to shoulder, my mentor, my leader and supporter of mine and great fighter for the unity of Nigeria that I will recommend to all my supporters and my delegates starting with the 48 delegates from Ekiti state alone and others from across the country is that you please accord me the respect to offer the support you are giving me to my elder brother, Asiwaju Bola Ahmed Tinubu. I am not doing him a favour but doing a duty of care for Nigeria."

OUR ENCOUNTER WITH DESTINY:

Udoedehe's decision to resign may have come after his faction of the party failed to be recognized by the national secretariat of the APC. Instead, it was a rival faction of the party that was given recognition following

a ruling by a Federal High Court.

The letter read in part that: "Henceforth, I cease to be a member of APC in my ward or anywhere for that matter. I hereby relinquish all rights which inured to me as a member of the APC, member

of the national advisory council and member of the national caucus of the APC.

"This decision to part ways with the APC is a tough one, but leadership entails adherence to the wishes of the vast majority of associates, allies and

supporters who have shown fidelity over time and have now witnessed the obduracy of the APC in handling the candidate selection processes in Akwa Ibom State.

"Our greater goal of providing service to the people of our dear state

remains sacrosanct," the letter stated.

It was also learnt that Udoedehe had secured the governorship ticket of the New Nigerian People's Party (NNPP) at the party primary election held the day he defected from APC.

Three aspirants step down for Osinbajo - campaign DG

Former Senate President, Ken Nnamani and two other presidential aspirants have stepped down for Vice President Yemi Osinbajo.

APC chieftain and Chairman, Senate Committee on Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), Kabiru Gaya, disclosed this while briefing CHANNELS TELEVISION on Tuesday in Abuja.

Although he didn't mention who the other aspirants are, there are speculations that they are ex-Ogun State governor, Ibikunle Amosun, and a Deputy Majority Leader of the Senate, Ajayi Boroffice.

Disclosing that the ruling party has decided to zone the presidential slot to the South-West region, he remarked: "We have Vice President Yemi Osinbajo and Bola Tinubu; it comes down to the South-West. I'm aware that a few aspirants have stepped down for Vice President Yemi Osinbajo. They are Ken Nnamani and two others. I think that will be announced later.

"Whatever the number the party decides; it is up for because the people need to come and address the party members and tell them if they are stepping down, why are they stepping down, and for who. If they are not stepping down, let them tell Nigerians what they intend to do to improve the situation in the governance of Nigeria."

According to Gaya, the APC took its decision to

give its presidential ticket to the southern region in the spirit of equity and justice.

He believes that the ruling party has sent a signal to Nigerians that it is not a regional or sectional association but one that is meant for all the masses.

"In principle, we have President Buhari from northern Nigeria that is serving seven years going to eight years; I think naturally, the power should shift to the south. That is what we have been talking about for over two years. I believe that Nigerians will believe that APC is the party for all. It is not a sectional or regional party.

"In any decision you take, it has merits and demerits. When the merits are more, then you say 'we', that is the majority. So, the majority of Nigerians accept that let the leadership of the presidency of APC or Nigeria go to the south and we all agreed to that," the lawmaker added.

Why I withdrew, by Nnamani

Earlier, Nnamani gave reasons for initially withdrawing from the presidential primary poll.

He, however, wished that a Southeast aspirant emerged as the party's candidate

Nnamani was bitter that the party jettisoned the zoning arrangement and monetisation of the entire primary process.

Addressing journalists in Abuja, Nnamani said: "the fact that leading northerners failed to indicate interest in the race convinced many of us that our party will thread the path of honour and justice by zoning its presidency to the south after a northern president has completed eight years.

"But the events of recent days created the impression that zoning had been

jettisoned in the APC.

"The vacillation of party leaders regarding zoning of the APC presidential ticket has not created clarity in the party and injures the confidence and faith of many in the south, particularly the southeast, in the party.

"It has the implication of suggesting to many in the party, including myself, that the party will allow conveniences of the moment to override foundational issues of justice and fairness."

He also faulted the process that led to the primary election. He bemoaned the confusion and uncertainty that beclouded the primary race. This, he said, frustrated effective campaign and made the primary a game for those with deep pocket.

"In the present circumstances, it does not make any sense for me to continue in the race, as I have not had the opportunity to market my profile and ideas to the delegates of our party in a manner that allow for deliberation and introspection.

"Therefore, I discontinue my aspiration and wish the party successful primary and unity of purpose so that we can win the 2023 general elections.

"I will continue to engage with the party and its leadership to make sure that the ideas and values that I cherish and propagate find strong footing in the party administration and in public leadership after election.

"No matter the outcome of the primary, I pray that our party does justice to the southeast that ought to present the next presidential candidate of our party," Nnamani added.

If we are fair, a Southeasterner should succeed Buhari, former Abia Governor, Ogbonnaya Onu told the delegates.

Buhari asked delegates to vote in a candidate with the best chance of victory. Don't allow PDP to drag us back, Buhari pleaded with the delegates

Delegates at the Eagles Square, Abuja were ecstatic as Vice President Yemi Osinbajo moved to address them.

He said he felt honoured to share the platform with 22 other Nigerians at the convention.

According to him, it is possible to have a first-class health care system, education, mining, and exploit oil and gas in the southeast and some northern states.

"You can't wish this country well and vote for someone you don't believe in. Your vote carries the answer to the prayer prayed for the future of our country and the future of our children," he said.

Consensus fails

Youthful Nicholas Felix stepped down for Osinbajo while the only woman aspirant, Barrister Uju Benedict Ohanenye stepped down for Tinubu to round off exciting addresses to the delegates by the aspirants.

Only Emeka Nwajiuba was not at the convention venue and therefore could not step up to address the delegates as did the 22 others that encapsulated their respective agenda for Nigeria.

With the speeches over, the stage was set for the elective convention by the accredited 2203 voting delegates.

Meanwhile, a number of the aspirants were exceptionally brilliant and oratorical in their speeches. Osinbajo, Bakare,

Senator Okorocho, and Fayemi, among others, were brilliant.

Former Senate President Ken Nnamani withdrew from the race without attending down for anyone. Nicholas Felix stepped down for Osinbajo.

Of all the seven that stepped down for Tinubu, only three of them control delegates from their states, namely: Gov Fayemi, Gov Badaru and Senator Akpabio.

This left thirty three states and Abuja still open for aspirants to hunt for delegates' votes.

Buhari urged any of the aspirants that won the ticket to be magnanimous in victory.

An observer remarked: "Emeka Nwajiuba, the first person to buy the N100M Presidential Nomination form left the convention venue without presenting himself and his programme to the Delegates. Those who deceived him into rushing into the Presidential race as the longest known Igbo friend and therefore closest person to Buhari, have abandoned him to his fate.

"Instead of him to go and mount the podium and make speeches along the lines of what Ken Nnamani and Ogbonnaya Onu have already said. He apparently abandoned the convention and ran away.

"Like other Igbo paper weight aspirants, Umahi, Okorocho etc at the convention, he could not openly step down for other popular Igbo aspirants as the Yoruba were doing and take the applause.

"Very, very sad and unfortunate."

Nine aspirants stepped down while the remaining 14 contested namely: Osinbajo, Tinubu, Amaechi, Lawan, Nwajiuba, Umahi, Bakare, Onu, Yerima, Okorocho, Bello, Jack-Rich, Ayade and Mokelu.

Court restrains Oborevwoori, PDP, INEC on guber race

Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) has been restrained in the interim by a Federal High Court sitting in Abuja from forwarding the name of Mr. Oborevwoori Sheriff Francis Orhowedor to the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) as the 2023 governorship candidate of the political grouping.

INEC was also restrained from receiving his name and acting in any manner recognising him as the standard bearer of the PDP for the election.

The court also restrained Oborevwoori from parading himself as

the candidate of the PDP for the election.

The orders emerged from an Exparte Motion in suit number FHC/ABJ/CS/715/2022 filed by Moses Ogege and Timinepere Ogobiri of Patani LGA Ward 8 before His Lordship, Hon Justice Taiwo O. Taiwo of the Federal High Court, Abuja Judicial Division on May 31, with the Peoples Democratic Party, the Independent National Electoral Commission and Francis Oborevwoori as 1st, 2nd and 3rd defendants, respectively.

After listening to Ibrahim Idris

SAN, JD Jefia, Osita Alele and Sarafadeen Salimo for the plaintiffs, the court found that there were sufficient grounds to grant the interim injunction sought.

Accordingly, the court ordered the defendants to enter a defence within seven days of service to show cause why the reliefs sought by the plaintiffs should not be granted.

It also ordered the defendants not to do anything along the line of presenting or accepting Mr Oborevwoori as the Delta PDP Governorship flag bearer nor Mr Oborevwoori acting in such manner

until the final determination of the matter by the court.

While the court also granted the plaintiff's prayers for accelerated hearing, the next date has been fixed for June 9.

Reacting, Fred Latimore, an aide of Delta State House of Assembly's Speaker Oborevwoori, said there was "no cause for worries" on the restraining order.

In a statement, he said: "It is the nature and legal procedures in all Interlocutory Injunction orders for the Respondent(s) to be so restrained in the wisdom of the Court.

"That order is not the Court

judgment in the substantive suit. The Defendant(s) and/or Respondent(s) usually file Defence and the restraining order may be vacated subject to evidence adduced or other legal factors.

"All Sheriffed Deltans and supporters of our Principal and party candidate should remain calm and hopeful.

"Delta PDF Guber Candidate, Rt Hon Sheriff Francis Oborevwoori shall be vindicated at the end of all litigations.

"These legal actions were foreseeable and do not call for worries at all."

'Why APC can't rule Delta in 2023

Commissioner for Information Charles Aniagwu has said the Deputy President of the Senate, Senator Ovie Omo-Agege and his All Progressives Congress (APC) could not win elections in Delta State to govern.

Aniagwu told a news conference in Asaba that Omo-Agege lacked requisite knowledge to govern Delta just as the performance of APC-led

Federal Government had made it very difficult to market any candidate from the party for the 2023 general elections.

He stated that he had recently advised Omo-Agege to concentrate his energy on things that could enhance his electoral value rather than chasing shadows. According to him, "not too long ago, I had advised the Deputy President of the Senate and APC governorship candidate in the state, Senator Ovie Omo-Agege, to try as much as possible to stay with the issues that could help his electioneering campaign and not to begin to stray in directions that will not in any way advance his interest.

"I had thought that it was only those who speak for him that tend not to understand what the issues are. I read somewhere, where he was mentioning that we have received over N700 billion in the last seven years and that we couldn't account for that and I begin to wonder N700 billion received as what.

"It shows that he does not understand how governance runs

because the data that are available show that we have received more than that. I say so because he thinks that what we use to run government alone in a year is N100 billion; our wage bill alone, that is the recurrent side of the budget, is even far more than what he was mentioning," he said.

Also, a group, Owo Is One Association, has condemned the attack which killed scores of people and rendered many injured.

The association, through its National Co-ordinator, Chief Akinboro Aruwajoye, said in a statement that the ugly incident came as a shock to all the indigenes of the ancient city of Owo, which has been known to be a peaceful community from time immemorial.

"We sympathise with our paramount ruler, His Imperial Majesty, Oba (Dr) Ajibade Gbadegeshin Ogunoye III, Olowo of Owo Kingdom, the families of the bereaved and the Catholic community, and pray to Almighty God to comfort each and everyone of us. We pray that the Almighty God should heal the wounded and the injured.

"We don't have any other place

we can call home but Owo, our native home.

"God Almighty, we pray to you that you come to our aid and put a divine stop to all this incessant killings in Owo.

"We pray for peace to reign in Owo, God should deliver us and protect our souls from every calamity of this world in Jesus name."

Condoling with Governor Rotimi Akeredolu of Ondo State, the association's Head of Media, Mr. Olatunbosun Oladimeji,

who is also a son of Owo, urged the authorities to ensure that the perpetrators are brought to justice. "Our government has the capability and the capacity to go after these devils. Our people should not only remain calm and be peaceful, but continue to pray for God to take control of our homeland," Oladimeji said.

Obaseki laments incessant strikes, pledges to meet demands on AAU

Governor Godwin Obaseki has assured protesting students from the state-owned Ambrose Alli University (AAU), Ekpoma, that his government will take necessary actions to reopen it amid the ongoing strike by the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU).

The students, on a peaceful protest, stormed the Government House in Benin City, on Tuesday, issuing a one-week ultimatum to the government to ensure the reopening of the institution or face a mass action by the students.

Addressing the protesters, Obaseki, represented by his Special Adviser on Media Projects, Mr. Crusoe Osagie, said education remains a top priority for the government, which will expedite action to ensure that the students get back to classes.

He said, "All that the leader of this protest has said today is in line with what the Edo State Government wants to do for the students of the institution. We have a challenge as the hand of the government is tied to some extent due to the activities of the various unions. Most institutions, including AAU, have staff unions and easily join strike actions called at the federal level; this is not in the best interest of the students and lecturers.

"Incessant strikes have become a problem in our higher institutions. Our proposition as a government is that at some point our lecturers should put the interest of the students above their own. We believe

that the reason they sit at home during the ASUU strike is that at the end of the day, whether they teach or not, they will be paid, and this is wrong. We call on university lecturers and workers in the university to come together and make a decision in the best interest of the students because the government is willing to support the institution with the resources it needs to run," he charged.

Obaseki further noted, "Lecturers should realise that the education of the students is more important than their unionism. The government is working on other steps to help the students come out of this problem. I urge them to come together to allow the students to learn instead of being on strike.

"I assure you that the one-week ultimatum given will be adhered to by the Governor as he will take steps and actions needed to get students back to school. I want to appeal to you that when the government takes its decision, the students should rise up in support of the government so that lecturers will abide by the decision of the government."

Earlier, the Vice President of the National Association of Nigerian Students (NANS) (Special Duties), Odiah Thomas Ikhine said they embarked on the peaceful protest to register their displeasure with the ongoing ASUU strike which has kept students at home for months. He called on the governor to emulate what is being done in Kogi State where there is no union and the academic calendar goes smoothly without strikes.

I've been vindicated by Owo massacre, says Sunday Igboho

Notable agitator, Mr. Sunday Adeyemi, has said the killing of Yoruba indigenes by terrorists in Owo, Ondo State has vindicated his agitation for emancipation of his people.

Last Sunday, about 50 worshippers were killed as terrorists attacked St. Francis Catholic Church, Owo as gunmen that invaded the church threw an improvised explosive device before they started shooting sporadically.

Adeyemi, popularly known as 'Sunday Igboho,' who reacted in a viral video from the Republic of Benin, said: "I pray to God that we don't experience such again. I pray to God to comfort the families of the victims.

"My fathers and mothers, can you see that I have been

vindicated? I was not in a battle with any Governor or Senator. But what I envisaged, you didn't see it. Now, can you all see?

"Many were saying I wanted to create crisis and foment trouble, but can you all see it now?

"Well, the situation can still be redeemed. I want Yoruba people to be united before it is too late.

"I want South West leaders to support me and other courageous Yoruba sons and daughters so that we can guard against these wicked acts. If I offend anyone, I ask for pardon, please."

A cross section of Nigerians including President Muhammadu Buhari, Vice President Yemi Osinbajo, Asiwaju Bola Tinubu, Alhaji Atiku Abubakar as well as religious and traditional leaders have condemned the dastardly act.

Anxiety over alleged terrorists' invasion of estate amid legal action threats

Fear has gripped residents of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) over an alleged invasion of private estate by terrorists popularly called bandits.

Some national dailies had reported that a large number of armed men, suspected to be bandits, in the early hours of Monday attacked 'Genuine' (Jenew) Estate, in the Gwarimpa area of Abuja and allegedly abducted an unspecified number of persons.

According to the report, the bandits who were armed with machetes, daggers and cutlasses, outnumbered and overpowered the security guards on duty and invaded some houses in the estate on 6th avenue behind Efab Queens.

A source was quoted as saying, "They operated in the estate for about three hours. They abducted some of the residents."

However, FCT Police Command spokesperson, DSP Josephine Adeh, said the case was a robbery case, not kidnapping.

Adeh said the police had already been mobilized to the scene to ascertain how the incident happened.

Residents of the area and FCT are currently apprehensive over the alleged invasion of the estate by the terrorists.

Reacting to the news, Anna Yusuf whose parents reside in the area said they confirmed the news to be true and cautioned people living in Gwarimpa to stay safe.

"Gwarimpa people please stay safe. My mom and dad live there and confirmed this to be true!" she tweeted.

Also, a resident of FCT who simply identified himself as Mohammed said everyone is in trouble as nowhere appears to be safe anymore in the country.

"Gwarimpa for that matter; directly or indirectly everyone is involved in this; it's even worse than it seems; until great attention is engaged to these, everyone is in trouble," he stated.

Meanwhile, Jenew Homes estate Karsana, Gwarimpa Abuja has debunked the alleged invasion of bandits on its property, saying the report was fake.

The company said there was neither kidnapping nor robbery incidence in their property.

The Real Estate company threatened to carry out legal action against the news media that public the report should they fail to describe the story as fake news on their social media handles within 24 hours.

According to a press statement by the company on Monday, Jenew Homes Karsana is one of the safest estates in Abuja, adding that security remains the watchword of the company.

"Good morning, today we woke up to the news of Kidnap at Jenew Homes estate Karsana, Gwarimpa Abuja, and calls have been coming in from residents who saw nothing happen where they live and families of the resident who wants to know about the safety and well-being of their loved ones.

Police arrest 24 armed political thugs in Keffi

•IGP establishes 2023 electoral offenses desks

Nigeria Police Force (NPF) has said about 24 armed political thugs were arrested in Keffi, Nasarawa State while warning against thuggery ahead of the 2023 elections.

The suspects are said to be loyal to a senatorial candidate in Nasarawa State.

In a statement by the Force Public Relations Officer, CSP Olumuyiwa Adejobi, on Tuesday, the police said eight pump action guns, two locally made revolver guns, 37 rounds of live cartridges, four bulletproof vests, and 27 mobile phones were recovered from the suspects.

"In line with this mandate, operatives of the Nigeria Police Force attached to the Keffi Area Command of the Nasarawa State Command, acting on credible and actionable intelligence have arrested twenty-four suspected

political thugs at Minki Suites, along Keffi-Akwanga Road.

"The thugs suspected to be loyal to an aspirant in the Nasarawa West Senatorial primaries came into the hotel in a convoy of seven private vehicles.

"Items recovered from the arrested suspects include; eight (8) pump action guns, two (2) locally made revolver guns, thirty-seven (37) rounds of live cartridges, four (4) bulletproof vests, twenty-seven (27) mobile phones, two (2) pairs of vigilante uniforms, five (5) cutlasses, ten (10) assorted knives, criminal charms, and other incriminating objects.

"Preliminary investigations reveal that the suspects, who are thugs for hire, carry out their heinous acts under the guise of being members of the Vigilante Group of Nigeria (VGN)," the statement said.

Meanwhile, the Inspector

•IGP establishes 2023 electoral offenses desks

General of Police, IGP Usman Alkali Baba, has ahead of the 2023 general elections, approved the establishment of Electoral Offences Desk at the Force Criminal Investigations Department (FCID), Force Headquarters, Abuja.

According to Adejobi, the Commissioner of Police, FCID, is the Desk Officer.

The IGP has equally approved the establishment of the Desk at State Commands across the nation with the Assistant Commissioners of Police in charge of the Criminal Investigation Departments as State Desk Officers.

"The mandate of the Electoral Offences Desk Officers includes the collation and investigation of all electoral offences/complaints from members of the public or any quarters, with a view to determining culpability in line with the amended Electoral Act 2022, and proffering charges before Courts of competent

jurisdiction for necessary legal action.

"The IGP tasked the Desk to commence its activities immediately with some isolated cases recorded during the pre-election activities such as screening, conventions, primaries, etc," Adejobi said.

Additionally, the IGP has also ordered the immediate transfer of the case involving the arrested suspects to the Electoral Offences Desk at the Force Criminal Investigation Department (FCID).

Adejobi said IGP Baba has ordered the FCID to effect, "the immediate arrest of the concerned aspirant for necessary investigative actions."

The Police boss reiterated the commitment of the Force to stamping out threats to peaceful and credible elections at all levels, even as he vows to deal decisively with anyone caught engaging in political thuggery.

Fayemi visits Owo attack victims, announces N50m NGF donation

Ekiti State Governor Kayode Fayemi has visited and commiserated with survivors of last Sunday's terrorist attack at St Louis Catholic Hospital, Owo, where some of them were receiving treatment following the bloodbath.

He is also the Chairman of Nigeria Governors Forum (NGF).

Dr. Fayemi also visited Governor Rotimi Akeredolu (SAN); Olowo of Owo kingdom, HRM Oba Ajibade Gbadegesin and the Catholic Bishop of Ondo Diocese, Most Rev Jude Arogundade, at the Bishop's Court, Akure.

Fayemi, accompanied by former Governor of Ogun State, Senator Ibkunle Amosun, urged security agencies to fish out the perpetra-

tors of the heinous crime. He also announced a donation of N50 million naira, on behalf of the NGF, to the Catholic Diocese to cushion the pains of the gruesome attack, which led to the killing of no fewer than 21 people with scores sustaining varying degree of injuries.

Fayemi said all efforts would be made to ensure that the perpetrators were apprehended and brought to book, adding that state government would redouble their efforts at ensuring safety and security of lives of the citizens.

He lamented that the situation was capable of making the people afraid to going about their daily activities including going to their

farms, pursuing their legitimate businesses and even going to places of worship. This he said calls for urgent attention to the issue of security in the country.

"All efforts towards ensuring the perpetrators are apprehended would be made, but this cannot bring the dead back to life. While we pray to God to intervene, we would also redouble our efforts and be more vigilant in our vicinity."

The governor later visited Gbadegesin at his palace where he commiserated with the monarch and the Olowo-in Council.

Thereafter, Fayemi visited St Louis Catholic Hospital, where some of the victims were receiving treatment. Some of the victims managed to narrate the ordeal to the governor and his colleagues.

Meanwhile, Fayemi has directed Ekiti State Commissioner for Health and Human services, Dr Banji Filani, to send medical and human resources to Ondo State.

"Every death or terrible situation like this diminishes us. We know how disturbed you are now. Government at state and federal levels are working together to ensure that the assailants are apprehended and also to ensure an end to these spate of attacks", he told the victims and the apparently bewildered relations who besieged the hospital.

Both Oba Gbadegesin and Bishop Arogundade called on the Federal Government to ensure the assailants were apprehended and to put measures in place to ensure safety of lives of the people.

Lawyers puncture Adamu's 'consensus' choice of Lawan

The race for the presidential ticket of the All Progressives Congress (APC) took a new twist barely 24 hours to the commencement of the special national convention with the announcement by the national chairman, Senator Abdullahi Adamu, that Senate President Ahmad Lawan was the party's consensus candidate.

The announcement raised dust as critical stakeholders vehemently rejected the choice of Lawan.

The Northern APC governors had insisted that power must shift to the South and that the party should consider the flag bearer among the southern aspirants. They, therefore, rejected Adamu's choice.

Also, Adamu's statement sowed discord among members of APC National Working Committee (NWC), with some disowning him. They said he expressed his own opinion and not that of the NWC or the party.

A top notcher of the APC told The Trumpet that Lawan was not adopted by the NWC, the party or President Muhammadu Buhari.

"Yes, it's true chairman announced it but it was not discussed or adopted by the NWC. He just announced it as his personal opinion, which cannot stand," he said.

Speaking with journalists after its NWC meeting on Monday, Suleiman Abubakar Argungu, National Organizing Secretary and other members of the committee including four national deputy chairmen said; "we were fully briefed about this development."

He said: "As you can see, we are all coming from the NWC meeting. We were fully briefed by our national chairman, Senator Abdullahi Adamu informed us that Senate President, Ahmed Lawan is the consensus candidate for the APC National Convention.

"That is just the information he gave us and not an issue that was discussed on the floor of the NWC.

"As you are aware, few days ago, the Northern governors had a meeting and decided that the leadership of this country should shift to the South and the southern governors also affirmed that.

"We, members of the NWC are also with the governors on what they said. Just a few minutes ago the governors of the North went to the presidency to inform the president that they are still standing on what they, northern governors, said regarding the presidency of this country.

"What the national chairman told us was just an information and all of us are entitled to our opinions because we are all Democrats. We can exercise that opinion.

"This was never deliberated by the NWC. It is an information given to us at the NWC. We don't have a divided house," he stated.

One of the strong advocates of power rotation to the south and governor of Ondo State, Arakunrin Rotimi Akeredolu said the APC chairman, Adamu is on a frolic of his own.

Describing Adamu's endorsement as an expensive joke, the governor

said "the speculation is rife that the Chairman took a flight of fancy and decided to make a pronouncement beyond his competence. He has, allegedly, made public his preferred choice as the candidate of the APC for the Office of the President in the next general elections."

According to Akeredolu, this alleged pronouncement runs contrary to the position of majority of Northern Governors in APC and their counterparts in the South.

"Our agreement is unanimous on this issue. The office of the President should be contested for by qualified persons from the Southern part of the country if the move to get a consensus candidate fails. There has been no shift from this settled issue.

"Let it be known that the Chairman or anyone who holds a contrary opinion does so at a personal level. He is at best embarking on a frolic which reasonable people will consider dangerous," he said on Monday.

But presidential media aide, Garba Shehu denied Buhari's endorsement of any candidate.

However, legal icon have picked on situations around Adamu's choice of a consensus candidate. They dissected what the law says about consensus and the context it was applied by Adamu.

Recall the the Electoral Act 2022 in "Section 84(9) (10) and (11) of the Electoral Act 2022 state as follows:

"(9) A political party that adopts a consensus candidate shall secure the written consent of all cleared aspirant for the position, indicating their voluntary withdrawal from the race and their endorsement of the consensus candidate".

Human right crusader and Senior Advocate of Nigeria, Femi Falana said there is "no consensus candidate without

consent".

In a short clarification, Falana said "a consensus candidate cannot be imposed on a political party by the President of the country or the Chairman of a political party. As far as the Electoral Act is concerned there can be no consensus candidate without the consent of all aspirants. Section 84 (9) (10) and (11) of the Act provides as follows:

"(9) A political party that adopts a consensus candidate shall secure the written consent of all cleared aspirants for the position, indicating their voluntary withdrawal from the race and their endorsement of the consensus candidate.

(10) Where a political party is unable to secure the written consent of all cleared aspirants for the purpose of a consensus candidate, it shall revert to the choice of direct or indirect primaries for the nomination of candidates for the aforesaid elective positions.

(11) A special convention or nomination congress shall be held to ratify the choice of consensus candidates at designated centres at the National, State, Senatorial, Federal and State Constituencies, as the case may be."

Another Senior Advocate of Nigeria, Babatunde Ogala said Adamu's pronouncement is legal impossibility.

He said "while the National Chairman is yet to deny or offer any clarification on the alleged declaration, it is necessary to state that such a declaration is a legal impossibility. This is because under the regime of the Electoral Act 2022, consensus, though provided for as one of the means by which a political party may produce its candidate, must specifically occur in a precise form.

"Section 84(9) (10) and (11) of the Electoral Act 2022 are the relevant provisions and they state as follows:

"(9) A political party that adopts a consensus candidate shall secure the

written consent of all cleared aspirant for the position, indicating their voluntary withdrawal from the race and their endorsement of the consensus candidate".

"(10) Where a political party is unable to secure a written consent of all cleared aspirants for the purpose of a consensus candidate, it shall revert to the choice of direct or indirect primaries for the nomination of candidates for the aforesaid elective position.

"(11) A special convention or nomination congress shall be held to ratify the choice of consensus candidates at designated centers at the National, State, Senatorial, Federal and State Constituencies, as the case may be".

He said instructively, none of the above conditions have occurred in respect of producing the presidential candidate of the APC. "Therefore, any declaration of a consensus candidate would be premature and a violation of extant provisions of the law.

"We are confident that as a law-abiding entity, the APC will not be part of such. We are further persuaded to urge our supporters to disregard this report considering that the overwhelming majority of the APC Northern Governors who, after meeting with the President, re-affirmed their preference for a president from the Southern part of Nigeria.

"This patriotic decision is widely accepted by all Nigerians as a demonstration of deep understanding of the nuanced fault lines of our nation."

Ogala, who is Director, Legal Directorate, Tinubu Campaign Organization, said in the circumstance, "a unilateral declaration by the National Chairman of a consensus presidential candidate for the party will not only violate the law, but set the party on collision course with its Governors who are critical stakeholders in the party."

PDP will retain 13 states in 2023, Ayu boasts

● *Only God can stop Okowa as Atiku's running mate*

National chairman of the People's Democratic Party, Dr. Iyorchia Ayu, has boasted that it will retain all its 13 states and more in the governorship and other elections in 2023.

He said in an interview after the presentation of certificate of return to gubernatorial candidates of the party at the PDP secretariat on Tuesday that the governors have performed very well.

"Most of them performed very, very well. We don't have any fears that the people will vote them back to power or their successors to power in those states where we don't have governors.

"People have seen the ineptitude, the incapacity of the APC-led administration from the governorship level to the presidency and I'm sure by next year people will be voting PDP so we are also very sure that we will capture most states."

The party's presidential candidate, Atiku Abubakar at the event said Nigerians are waiting for the emergence of the PDP to take over power in 2023

Atiku assured all elected candidates of the party that he will work together with them as a team and make sure you all are brought back elected as governors in their respective states.

"The question of saying that all we are going to give a quarter or so to the ruling party must not arise in this election.

"The processes, which have made you to emerge are now history, what is before us is a task that we must all unite and achieve for this party and for Nigerians.", he said.

Twenty six governorship candidates

out of the 28 states were presented with certificate of return while candidates of Ebonyi and Kano were exempted because of litigation in their states.

And as the leaders of PDP anxiously search for a widely acceptable running

mate to Atiku, Delta State Governor Ifeanyi Okowa has been suggested as the right candidate.

Delta State Commissioner of Information, Mr. Charles Anuagwu, said only God could stop Okowa from becoming the running mate.

Aniagwu stated this at a press conference in Asaba while reacting to speculations that former governor of the state, Chief James Ibori, was secretly working against Okowa's chances to be Atiku's running mate. He dismissed this as rumour and handiwork of fifth columnists.

Aniagwu said, "the governor has contributed to the growth of the PDP, he doesn't boast about it because as a member of the party he has the responsibility to do that.

"You also know how many times the party brought him in to assist in conducting primaries. I am not aware if there is anybody who is bringing any roadblock, if there is anybody who is going to block Okowa, I think it should be God.

"And the last time I checked I don't think he has offended God for God to take that decision against him.

"So we are on course, I don't think there is any problem between Okowa and Ibori, these are persons who have worked together very closely. And Okowa has continued to respect our leader, Chief James Ibori. I have not heard Ibori speak evil of Okowa neither have I heard my boss speak badly of Ibori."

'Why I quit presidential race'

Activist Engineer Esanerovo Trinity Agbodo who was running as an independent candidate for the 2023 presidential election has withdrawn from the race.

In a statement entitled, 'WITHDRAWAL FROM THE 2023 PRESIDENTIAL RACE IN PROTEST,' he said:

"Nigeria's elections process promotes corruption. I don't want to be a corrupt President. NIGERIA BY SHAREHOLDING campaign continues.

"INEC should peg fees for nomination forms in future elections. EFCC should investigate and arrest culprits in delegates alleged bribery.

"I thank all Nigerians and friends of Nigeria that have been pouring messages of support for my presidential ambition since I declared my intention to run for the topmost political position.

But based on my assessment of the tasks ahead and the undulating complications of our electoral processes, I have decided to withdraw and want to present my observations and contributions to make electoral matters better in the future."

He added: "I wish to inform all my teaming supporters that I, Citizen ESANEROVO AGBODO, have resolved after due consultations to withdraw from the 2023 presidential race in protest against the high fees of obtaining nomination forms and the burden of election costs on aspirants and candidates.

"In as much as I could have been able to obtain the form in a political party I have pitched my tent in my capacity and with the support of well-wishers, I decided to step down my ambition to

make the point very clear that, with the current process of elections in Nigeria, corruption will continue to thrive either openly or clandestinely.

"For instance, how can we explain the rationale behind political parties making a Presidential aspirant to obtain a nomination form at a fee of 100 million naira and the aspirant will still go across the country from state to state to consult with delegates, and like what we heard with thousands of dollars offered to delegates as bribes, win the primary election ticket of the party, and move on to mobilize and even borrow funds to prosecute the general election campaign and perhaps win the election. Then when he or she becomes president, we will expect him to tell those he borrowed money from to wait patiently while he pays back with his meager salary and allowances over the next four years. This procedure cuts across almost all political parties and all political offices from House Assembly to Presidency.

"Even if I kowtow to the argument in some quarters that the high fees were to streamline the number of aspirants, political parties can adopt other methods like looking at the convictions and ideas of aspirants through a one-page document to distinguish between serious aspirants and jokers.

"President Barack Obama and other United States Presidents did not emerge by how deep their pockets were but by the ideas they promoted. We need to change the way we do things in Nigeria if we are really serious with

developing ourselves and curbing youth unemployment, militancy and other vices.

"The truth is that with the way election processes are structured today, it will be very difficult to win the war against corruption and poverty may continue to ravage our land, God forbid. Poverty is in the root of all the crises in Nigeria. Unless all hands are on the deck to combat poverty, our development as a nation will be hindered.

"Therefore, I am withdrawing from the Presidential race because I insist that the fees for nomination forms across most of the political parties are very high and are already inducing corruption in the future. Unless the federal government through INEC reviews the process and peg nomination fees for political parties to reasonable amounts for different offices in the future, corruption may continue unabated in Nigeria and all the efforts of our EFCC will be seen to be hypocritical.

"Until this moment, EFCC has not made any arrest irrespective of all we heard that money in hard currencies changed hands during the primaries elections of political parties.

"If we must build a greater nation, we must change our strategy because if we keep doing the same thing in the same old way that has fuelled corruption, then the system will continue to lament youth unemployment, lack of requisite infrastructure and the rest.

"My withdrawal from the race has only given me more time to ruminate on Nigeria's challenges to bring lasting solutions to them. I and my support-

ers are however working on other options to continue our programmes especially in promoting the NIGERIA BY SHAREHOLDING under which every Nigerian will be a registered shareholder in a National Company and monies paid to them as Nigeria earns income. We will come out with details of this programme soon and reach all political parties with the blueprint for possible endorsement from 2023.

"We will also continue to explore other opportunities either from the non-governmental approach or from collaboration with government institutions and international agencies to continue to serve our country with innovative ideas for the betterment of everyone.

"We are collaborating with some Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) to ensure that it is not only UniAbuja that is addressing this issue, but we have a strong partnership.

"We cannot allow the lives of our students to be destroyed, most of the abuses destroy the lives and destinies of their victims."

The VC noted that the university is currently investigating the activities of lecturers who are abusing female students

some of the achievements recorded by the Commission under the present Board.

He emphasized the need for both organizations to work together, especially in the areas of information gathering and intelligence sharing and the adoption of new techniques in the fight against corruption and all other forms of crimes in the state.

Ebhotemen solicited the cooperation of the Commandant and his men to support the Commission, majorly in the areas of provision of NSCDC armed men to provide security cover for personnel and facilities of the Commission, training, and other operations of ICPC in the state.

ICAN disowns suspended Accountant-General

Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria has said that it cannot sanction the suspended Accountant General of the Federation, Ahmed Idris, over his alleged involvement in an N174bn fraud, saying he is not a member of the body.

This was contained in a statement by the Institute on Monday while responding to a letter written by the Human and Environmental Development Agenda (HEDA) asking ICAN to investigate and sanction Idris who is being probed by the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC).

HEDA had called on ICAN to subject

Ahmed to the Institute's Disciplinary Tribunal for thorough investigation and sanction.

Responding to the letter, the Registrar/Chief Executive Officer of ICAN, Prof Ahmed Kumshe, said that the Institute cannot sanction Ahmed because he was not a member of ICAN.

"The attention of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria has been drawn to some publications in the media where a group known as Human & Environmental Development Agenda is asking ICAN to investigate and sanction the erstwhile Accountant-General of the Federation being probed

by the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission for corruption.

"We wish to inform the organisation and the general public that the former Accountant-General, Alhaji Ahmed Idris, is not a member of ICAN and therefore cannot be investigated and sanctioned by ICAN.

"Our act only allows us to regulate and discipline our members when they err at our Investigating Panel or Disciplinary Tribunal as the case may be," he said.

Three days after his arrest, Idris was suspended by the Minister of Finance, Budget and National Planning, Zainab Ahmed, to allow for a seamless investigation.

The Federal Government also appointed Anamekwe Nwabuoku to oversee the Office Accountant-General of the Federation in the interim.

However, the EFCC has released Idris on bail pending further investigations.

A former Governor of Zamfara State, Abdul'Aziz Yari, has also been arrested over the alleged scam.

The Accountant-General of the Federation is the administrative head of the treasury of the country and is saddled with the responsibility of managing receipts and payments on behalf of the country.

EFCC, Law School partner to revive Economic Crimes Law Report

● NGO calls for collaboration with anti-graft agency

Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) and the Nigeria Law School have brokered a fresh partnership. It is aimed at reviving the journal, Economic Crimes Law Report.

A statement by the spokesperson of the anti-graft agency, Wilson Uwujaren, said the Executive Chairman of the EFCC, Abdurashheed Bawa made the proposal to a delegation from Nigeria Law School led by the Director General, Professor Isah Hayatu Chiroma.

"Executive Chairman of the EFCC, Abdurashheed Bawa hinted at this new-fangled initiative on Monday, June 6, 2022, when a delegation from the Nigeria Law School, led by its Director General, Professor Isah Hayatu Chiroma, SAN, paid him a Courtesy Visit at the EFCC's corporate headquarters in Abuja," Uwujaren said.

He further stated that the EFCC boss noted that the agency has been instrumental to the development of law in Nigeria and wants the two institutions to partner to achieve more positive strides.

Bawa was quoted to have said, "I am not aware of any institution of government that has contributed to the development of law in Nigeria in the last fifteen years (15) other than the EFCC. Last year alone, we secured two thousand, two hundred and twenty convictions (2,220), and this year, we have on record more than one thousand five hundred convictions thus far."

Earlier, Prof Chiroma expressed appreciation to the EFCC for reposing confidence in the Law School in the area of documenting economic and financial crimes cases. He commended the EFCC for its record of convictions and sought more commitments to "training and retraining of staff".

Tragic killings across the country

Nigeria is on the edge of a dangerous precipice occasioned by a surge in tragic and wanton killings in the land. Killing of innocent persons across the country has become the norm rather than the exception. The most recent is that of a pregnant mother Hariri Jubril and her four little children in Anambra State. Two weeks before, Deborah Yakubu was set ablaze by some of her College of Education classmates in Sokoto. These incidents left the nation in shock. 'Shock' is the wrong word. We are no longer "shocked" at the news of killings. We are merely "troubled" or "disturbed" or, worse, "nonchalant". Sadly, we quickly recover from these emotions and carry on with our lives. This may seem trivial. It is not. It is a big tragedy – we are losing our basic humanity or humaneness. And the federal government appears overwhelmed!

How did we descend into such barbarity? How human are we when we shrug our shoulders at the news of a girl being burnt alive by her own classmates? How human are we when we sleep normally at night after seeing a video of a woman and her fiancé having their heads chopped off while still alive? How human are we if we can continue to enjoy our meal after seeing the corpses of a woman and her four little children slain in the street for the crime of being different? How do gloss over the deaths of scores of people in a Boko Haram attack? Is Mr. President able to sleep with so much blood being shed in the land under his watch?

The deaths of fellow Nigerians, our own brothers, and sisters, have become nothing but numbers – 30 people killed here, 12 people killed there. We have lost our humanity, and we are out of touch with what it means to be human. The English poet Matthew Arnold (1822-1888) believed that there was a beast in every one of us that needed to be tamed if society were to attain civilisation. Unfortunately, the beast

in all of us is threatening to take over the souls of Nigerians. The mark of this beast is not 666. It is lack of empathy, sympathy, fellow feeling, and goodwill. Its mark is a totally anaesthetised attitude towards horror and terror. This beast looks upon the death of a fellow human being with indifference. It makes the appropriate "noises" such as "oh no!", "how unfortunate" and, for perhaps a few days, "justice must be served!". Its "duty" done, the beast goes on as usual. This is what we have become. Beasts. This is the tragedy of Nigeria. The killers themselves are unusual – they are the greater beasts. They maim and deface or burn the corpses – an indication that the anger levels are too high.

It is not only the Nigerian citizen who

has become anaesthetised to tragedy. It is the Nigerian system in its entirety. Nigeria has become a failed state. When systems of government fail, the citizens rebel. It leads to anomie, anarchy, and general lawlessness. Our politicians carry on with their campaigns as though Nigerians are not dying daily. In fact they use these deaths to promote themselves, promising to end it all if they are elected. In the meantime they have surrounded themselves with police and armed personnel while ordinary Nigerians sleep with only one eye closed.

The government must rise to its obligations and address the dehumanization of Nigerians and the endless killings. The government should seriously consider allow the establishment of State Police. The federal security forces are overwhelmed and often are not familiar with the terrain to which they are posted. State police would be at home on their turf since they are from the same area. They will be far more efficient at identifying criminals and perpetrators of violence. They would also have the added advantage of familiarity – local people will feel freer with them and would be more forthcoming with information.

The government should call on religious and community leaders to emphasize the sanctity of human life and the importance of peace, unity, brotherhood, and good neighbourliness. The government should involve traditional and religious leaders in forming vigilante groups that would be responsible for fishing out criminals and handing them over to the authorities.

Finally, the judiciary needs to get serious. It must show that it is impartial and will not allow any crime to go unpunished. Extra-judicial killings happen as a consequence of a failed judiciary. In Nigeria justice is given only to the highest bidder. The judiciary needs to restore the faith of Nigerians in the system. The current situation where everybody is a law unto himself has got to end. Nigeria deserves better.

Edging towards the precipice

Nigeria is edging towards the precipice. The long history of scant regards for the rules of engagement has caught up with us. There is loss of faith in the ability of Nigeria to protect its citizens. There is despair. There is frustration. The managers of the federation take steps daily, carry out actions which threaten the existence of the country. Ensnared in the opulence of filthy power, they do not feel the pulse of the nation. If they do, they do not show it. Individuals have become more powerful than the country. Self help has become the order of the day. The brutish state of nature which we escaped from is here.

Those who are in power are helping themselves with the national cake before the house crumbles. The anti-corruption mantra of the incumbent government is a joke. The party primaries offend our sense of collective dignity. The people are angry with the politicians in Abuja and the State capitals. But there is nothing they can do. They will still vote for the clowns in 2023! Some have taken their share of the national delegates at the party primaries. They have sold their conscience!

Religion and politics have mixed to destroy the country. There is lip service to the ideals of religion. Religion has not defined life in daily encounter with reality. But it has become an ego bank. A fence. A wall. A protectorate which is conveniently deployed to stress difference. It has not stopped stealing. It has not stopped corruption. With State

funds, men can build Mosques and churches. The religions preach against stealing. Yet adherents steal funds to feed religion. It is odious. It is a contradiction. Looting the treasury is a dent on character. These characters go to the Mosque on Fridays, to the church on Sundays, visit the Holy Lands on pilgrimage. Yet, when a man as much as criticize their proclaimed religion, they are prepared to kill.

The young man who boasted on social media that he murdered Deborah Yakubu played a script, written by the powerful men in the corridors of power. Disobey the tenets of the religion. But kill the next man who utters a word against what they hold sacred. It is barbaric. It is destructive. It is atavistic. Yet, governance, if it qualifies to be so called, is all about blasphemy against the morals and ideals of the great religions. This is a paradox that the leadership class luxuriates in. Thus, we have no reports of men who reject eating the stolen pie on account of religion. That is a no-go area. Paradise is preached. Paradise is believed. But the paradise of here and now created from pilfered funds at the expense of the lives of God's own children is more attractive!

The federal government promotes a dangerous narrative. It proclaims a federation in words. But it practices oligarchy of a sort. This oligarchic disposition is woven into ethnic statis. Power belongs to us. There is a veneer of population advantage. But anyone who has lived in the north wonders where

the huge population figures come from. The British who promoted the ascendancy of the north in governance helped to create the myth of superior population. The successor government sustained the myth. But within the vaunted superior population is the existence of a minority group. This group has seized power. Ruthless in power acquisition, they are yet to learn how to deploy power to the development and growth of their own people. What is power for if it cannot change the circumstances of the people?

We are on the precipice, the edge of it. The journey to doom started long ago. Through wrong-headed economic and political policies, the rulers started the decimation of Nigeria. If the people had their way now, they would dissolve Nigeria. Perhaps what has somewhat held the nation together is the reluctance of state officials in aggrieved regions and areas to take on the federal government as Emeka Ojukwu did in 1967. Non-state actors have filled the vacuum. These non-state actors hold the elected and selected state officials in great contempt. In the north, Boko Haram, bandits, and Islamic terrorists terrify state officials. In the southeast, non-state actors control the first day of the week. The South-south once held in the jugular by militants is the only region free of control by non-state actors. Indeed, there is no guarantee that if another rebellion of the Ojukwu shade were to start today, there would be no national consensus for the rest of the federation to bring back

the rebellious region. There is too much disenchantment with the terms of the federal union. Away to your tents is on the lips of most southerners, in and out of government. Who will bell the cat, appears to be the restraining factor?

Before the civil war of 1967, there was a dingdong between state actors and the federal government. But there was a patchwork going on. The back of the camel got broken after the coup and counter-coup. It was a turning point. The centre could not hold. The arrogance which Abuja currently displays, the attempt to seize power in the north, to jettison rotation of power between the two main regions which patently suggests a rotation between practitioners of the two rival religions, is a threat to peace. To retain power in the north in 2023 is the equivalent of a coup against the people of the south. Through bulldozing and intimidating methods, the north could hold on to power. But the seed of splitting the nation along regional lines is going deeper and deeper into the soil of time. Let us not allow the heat in the na-

tion to reach breakpoint. No one will have a tea party if there is a conflagration.


It takes no rocket science to surmise that we do not have an Army that can overrun Nigeria if there is widespread rebellion. Pushed to the wall, the people will have no choice but to go into martyrdom. It is not the way we should go. Yet, if we continue along the current path, the day of an implosion is just a matter of time. It will be inevitable.

So it was that a car that was parked by tourists in a park was swarmed by a troop of monkeys. They took control of the car and chased away the real owners. But they could not drive the car. A man who seizes power anywhere and fails to use it for the betterment of the people who are the ultimate owner of power is like the monkeys in the anecdote. Violent crimes threat to Nigeria's survival, says CJN

Seeks speedy trial of terrorism, banditry suspects

Chief Justice of Nigeria (CJN) Ibrahim Muhammad, has said the increase in violent crimes such as terrorism and banditry poses as a threat to the survival of the country.

He said this at the opening ceremony of a workshop for officers at the National Judicial Institute (NJI) in Abuja. The level of insecurity in the country not only exposes the polity's unpreparedness but also hobbles economic development and improvement in the country's human development.

The CJN further noted that the effect of terrorist-related activities, such as destruction of lives, public infrastructure, private and entrepreneurial investments has continued to project Nigeria as an

unsuitable destination for foreign investments.

He said, "My lords, distinguished participants, ladies and gentlemen, we are all living witnesses to the fact that terrorism obscures every aspect of economic, social, cultural and political life, it brings instability and disrupts peace and coexistence in the society.

"In the light of the above, we cannot ignore this threat or wish it away. Preventing domestic terrorism and reducing the factors that fuel it, demand a multifaceted response from the three arms of government."

While addressing Judges, Justice Muhammad advocated for the need to speedily determine terrorism-related cases, saying that such trial must be fair and based on specific evidence.

"You must ensure that the investigation and prosecution of terrorism-related criminal

cases, including 'of incitement to' and 'recruitment for terrorism', should be based on specific evidence, guarantee due process and fair trials.

"To this end, it is the duty of Judicial Officers to ensure these matters are dispensed within line with the rule of law," he said.

Meanwhile, in his welcome address, Administrator of the NJI, Justice Salisu Abdullahi, said the theme of the workshop, "Law and National Security: The Role of the Judiciary", sought to reinforce the need for judicial officers and law enforcement agencies to understand the dynamism

of the laws on national security.

He said, "My lords, we can all agree that terrorism and other related violent crimes is an aberration and a threat to peace, security and economic prosperity of any nation.

"No doubt, it leads to influx of refugees and a surge in terms of internally displaced persons; it creates instability, restrictions on human rights and indeed, a hindrance to social, economic and political development.

"In the light of the foregoing and without prejudice to the complexity involved in adjudicating matters of national security, I want to urge other stakeholders in the fight against terrorism to be responsive and proactive in order to accelerate and ensure swift trial of suspects within reasonable time."

Participants at the workshop were judges that were drawn from various Divisions of the Federal High Court and Court of Appeal.

Police step up security nationwide

There is fresh tension across the Southern part of Nigeria following last Sunday's terrorist attack carried out inside a Catholic Church in Owo, Ondo State where no fewer than fifty (50) worshippers were murdered in broad daylight.

The fear followed intelligence reports from locals and top security agencies that unknown gunmen believed to be foreign terrorists have gained entry into Nigeria through the porous borders at a time when the country is still grappling with many challenges, especially in the North-East and South-East of the Country.

Following the Owo attack, Inspector General of Police (IGP) Usman Alkali Baba directed all Assistant Inspectors General (AIGs) and the 36 States Commissioners of Police to step up their security architecture across the nooks and crannies of their various using proactive measures to forestall possible terrorist attacks.

The Trumpet gathered from top Police sources that in line with the IGP directives which was contained in a signal, all the top officers met on Monday at their various command in a tight security meeting to reveal what happened in Owo, Ondo State and plan a new strategy to forestall attacks by terrorists who are bent on unleashing terror on targeted places in the Country.

Already the Anti-bomb unit of the Force has been directed to expand its operations across the Country. The unit discovered some explosive devices in the recent attack on a Catholic Church in Owo.

The high command has also advised the management of Churches, Mosques, and other strategic places to take their security seriously by demanding such from their various commands when they suspect any unknown faces or move around their locations.

It could be recalled that the Department of State Security (DSS) had raised the alarm last month over a plot by terrorist groups to renew attacks on target places like Churches, Mosques, and critical government Infrastructures, among others.

According to a top security source who spoke with The Trumpet, "We always received intelligence reports but sometimes we look down on them that is where we as security agencies are having problems."

IGP deploys experts for full-scale investigation of Owo terror attack

Inspector General of Police (IGP Usman Alkali Baba) has ordered a full-scale investigation that can lead to the arrest of criminals who attacked St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church, Owaluwa in Owo, Ondo State during a service on Sunday, killing scores of innocent worshippers.

Force Public Relations Officer, CSP Olumuyiwa Adejobi, in a press statement said the IGP has deployed specialized operatives of the Explosive Ordnance Devices - Chemical Biological

Police recover unexploded IEDs

Radiological and Nuclear Explosives (EOD-CBRNE), police experts, and other tactical units from the Force Headquarters commence a comprehensive investigation for immediate arrest of the perpetrators.

The statement said: "The gunmen, from preliminary investigations, invaded the church with arms and materials suspected to be explosives. Police Investigators who were part of the First Responders deployed to the scene have recovered pellets of

expended AK-47 ammunition while the Explosive Ordnance Devices-Chemical Biological Radiological and Nuclear Explosives (EOD-CBRNE) unit confirmed the use of Explosives as fragments of the IEDs used were found and after thorough sweeping of the scene, 3 unexploded IEDs were recovered at the scene of the incident.

"Further investigations revealed that some of the gunmen disguised as congregants, while other armed men who had

positioned themselves around the church premises from different directions, fired into the church. The assailants fled the scene using a Nissan Sunny car with Reg No. AKR 895 AG which was snatched from the owner, and escaped through Owo/Ute road. The vehicle has been recovered while the owner of the vehicle is currently assisting the Police in its investigations.

"The IGP has ordered full-scale investigations into the incident in order to bring to book the perpetrators of the gruesome killing of the worshippers at the church. The IGP has further ordered

the deployment of specialized operatives of the Police EOD-CBRNE, police experts, and other tactical units from the Force Headquarters for a comprehensive investigation, and for immediate interception of the Villians."

According to the statement, the IGP condoled with the Ondo State Government, family members, relatives and friends of the victims who lost their lives.

Baba equally assured that the killers would be made to face the full wrath of the law, while the police will employ strategies to forestall similar occurrences in the future.

Afreximbank, Titan Trust Bank sign \$300m deal to support traders with \$3b

Titan Trust Bank (TTB) has obtained \$300 million from the African Export Import Bank (Afreximbank) to acquire Union Bank of Nigeria (UBN). It is a financial backing that will see Titan Trust Bank leveraging the acquisition to provide capital for intra-African trade.

Afreximbank provided the \$300 million, which is described as an Intra-African Investment Financing Facility to improve the support African traders would receive from financial markets for the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA).

With the deal between Afreximbank and Titan Trust Bank, which enabled the latter to acquire 95.41 per cent stakes in UBN, a \$3 billion financing medium-term facility would be disbursed by TTB, as the acquisition would grant the

firm access to Union Bank's capital base.

A statement issued by Afreximbank's Media Liaison Executive, Amadou Sall, disclosed that: "Afreximbank's financial support will enable TTB to secure the acquisition of a well-capitalised bank with an extensive network, enabling the entity to better serve vital economic activities of the public sector, companies, and small and medium-sized enterprises."

"The development impact of the acquisition will be immense as TTB will leverage the merged entity to provide financing of about \$3 billion in the medium-term of which over \$600 million will directly support financing of intra-regional trade."

Meanwhile, President and Chairman, Board of Directors of Afreximbank, Benedict Oramah, said deals of this nature with the bank and TTB would bridge the gaps being left by foreign investors, as they exit Africa's

market.

"As international capital retreats from Africa, we must redouble our efforts to build an effective and resilient financial services sector on the continent committed to intra-Africa trade and investments, as well as development of regional financial value chains.

"Afreximbank is confident that the transaction will engender confidence in the Nigerian financial system and attract additional capital investments. It would also support the financial inclusion of small and medium scale enterprises, women-led businesses, youth enterprises and start-ups which are critical to the successful implementation of the Africa Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA)," Oramah stated.

NAICOM may grant web aggregators operational licence

National Insurance Corporation (NAICOM) has disclosed that it has received applications from people seeking operational license to operate web aggregators.

Head, Corporate Communications and Market Development of NAICOM, Rasaaq Salami, disclosed this in Lagos yesterday, adding that the insurance sector regulator has received applications and that the licencing department was reviewing them.

NAICOM had pegged the minimum share capital of web aggregator at N5 million and registration fee at N3 million.

Web aggregators are insurance companies that provide information on underwriting businesses offered by different companies. They also provide a comparison of insurance products and prices of different insurance products.

Salami explained that the web aggregator concept was

developed to compare different prices of insurance products, adding that the aggregators either maintain a website or own a website to provide information on insurance products for regulating companies and as such, they need licences to operate.

He said having an insurance web aggregator licence would not only permit the companies to display insurance products, but also solicitation of policies, adding that solicitation is done through online portal where information provided to the customers.

According to NAICOM, a web aggregators are expected to have a minimum share capital of not less than N5 million as of the date of application and shall continue to maintain the same capital base throughout the licence period, even as the web aggregator shall submit daily financial position to the commission.

The principal activities of the company include processing raw salt into refined, edible and industrial salt, as well as production of seasonings and vegetable oil.

Nigerians, businesses groan under power outages

Business owners in Lagos State and its environs have decried the current power outage that happened in the past two weeks.

Investigations by *The Trumpet* showed that businesses and individuals were already counting their losses as a result of the current power outage.

The owner of a Small and Medium Enterprise (SME), Okechuku Obinna, said his area, Ketu, Lagos has not experienced public power supply in the last two weeks, adding that the situation has also adversely affected water supply to the area.

Obinna said people now depend on water vendors, who go about with their trucks or wheel barrows hawking water to households.

"The past few days have been so difficult for me and people of my area. We have not been supplied power for close to two weeks, which has also affected water supply to the entire area.

"We now rely on water vendors who hawk water with their trucks or wheel barrows. Our problem is compounded with the serious heat. I can't sleep without my air-conditioner, but without public power supply, it is difficult," he lamented.

Confirming the power situation,

a statement on the website of Eko Distribution Company (EKDC) reads: "There was a significant drop in power allocation to its network from the Transmission Company of Nigeria (TCN). This has led to massive load shedding. Kindly bear with us, as we are currently working with our TCN partners for a quick resolution. We sincerely apologise for the inconvenience."

Also, the Ikeja Electric Distribution Company (IKDC) sent a short message to some of its customers, saying: "We apologise for the current power outage being experienced in Lagos State. We are working round the clock to rectify the issue. Please do bear with us."

However, a promoter of a Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), Peter Idovah, told *The Trumpet* that the situation in the Ikeja axis has been ongoing for close to two weeks.

Idovah lamented that his raw materials, which he uses to produce chicken feeds were going bad as his generator could not work for long hours without breaking down, adding that his firm was no longer able to meet his customers' demands.

He argued that the electricity bills the IEDC will send to him for June 2022 will not reflect that there was no light for several days and that each month, the company fails

to supply electricity for days and weeks, but does not fail to give one excuse or the other, adding that such excuses no longer meant anything to him.

"Power supply to our area since about two weeks now has been virtually non-existent. The electricity company has said that the supply from TCN is low and as such, we should exercise patience while they fix the fault.

"Their excuses have become too many that they no longer make any meaning to me and to most Nigerians. Why must there be fault every month that will take days and weeks to rectify? Is that what is obtainable elsewhere? he asked.

Idovah said the excuses for the constant faults had become too many, adding that the various electricity companies were only interested in the money they get from Nigerians, while they leave them in perpetual darkness.

"It is sad that Nigerians have to constantly rely on generators for energy supply. We all know how much diesel is sold today. Most businesses have to reduce their operational hours to optimise production costs. I appeal to the media to help us plead with the government and the electricity companies to fix the country's power supply system," he stated.

Another businessman, Balogun Tunde, in a telephone interview

with *The Trumpet*, lamented that his small office that runs services for some clients was being billed between N70,000 and N80,000 monthly, while power supply remains about 10 to 12 hours before the total blackout.

Tunde, who declined to reveal the name of his firm for fear of backlash from the EKDC, added that his office at Ajah axis of Lagos had been in perpetual darkness and that despite the constant power outages, the bills keep rising.

"Ajah and its environs, is always in darkness now and then over one excuse or the other. But the bills keep increasing every month. We are helpless as the price of diesel has increased beyond the reach of the average company," he lamented.

Another respondent and employee of the Lagos Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI), who spoke on condition of anonymity, said his office has been permanently run on generator since the last power outages.

He said although the company used to provide power once in a while, it only lasts for a few minutes or an hour at the most, adding: "Power supply has been very poor in Victoria Island and Ikoyi despite the high tariff we are being billed. The last two weeks have been particularly difficult for businesses in terms of power supply in Lagos based on feelers from our members across the state."

Also, a Chartered Accountant, who runs an auditing firm in Surulere told *The Trumpet* that his office was currently been run on generators, saying: "I can tell you categorically that power supply has dropped in the recent days. We now run between 10:00a.m. and 3:00p.m. instead of 9:00a.m to 4:30p.m and this has been bad for most businesses in the country.

"Even in our homes, we don't have light. To sleep is difficult, because the heat is much, although we should have been in the rainy season," he added.

A barber at Adamo area of Ikorodu in Lagos State, Tony Odeh, said the past few weeks had been tough for his barbing saloon, adding that the union of barbers had to increase the amount they charge their customers.

"Since we are running our saloons with our small generators, we now charge N500 to cut the hair of adults instead of the initial N400, while we take N300 from children instead of N200, once we use generator to cut hair.

"We are all suffering the power outages that have become so worrisome since the beginning of the year. Our union leaders added N100 to the cost we formerly charge, if there is no light and we are bound by it.

"It was a decision taken at our general meeting, so we are all in agreement with it. Any barber that flouts the resolution is punished if caught," he stated.

Nigeria's equity capitalisation gains N96b, as naira weakens to N426.25

Nigeria's Equity Market closed on a positive note on Monday with the index increasing by 0.34 per cent while the capitalisation gained N96 billion.

The upward trend in the market was driven by Fidelity Bank Plc, Julius Berger and Union Bank Plc, which was recently taken over by its new owners, Titan Trust Bank (TTB).

The All Share Index (ASI) increased by 0.34 per cent to close at 53,086.46 basic points compared with 52,908.24 points the previous day.

It also increased by 0.34 per cent to close at 53,908.24 points the previous trading day. The market capitalisation of equities listed on the Nigerian Stock Exchange (NGX) increased to N28.619 trillion from N28.523 trillion, as of the close of trading the previous day.

The total volume traded closed with an exchange of 755.624 million units valued at N8.90 billion traded in 4,217 deals, while the market breadth was positive with 19 gainers as against 13 losers.

Also, the NGX 30 index increased by 0.39 per cent to close at 2,929.99 points as against 1,922.43 points the previous day.

Besides, market turnover

closed with a traded volume of 669.50 million units, just as Fidelity Bank and Julius Berger were the key gainers, while Unilever and Ecobank Nigeria Limited are key losers.

Specifically, the shares of Fidelity Bank gained 3.64 per cent, Union Bank gained 2.67 per cent, Julius Berger gained, while Union Bank gained 2.40 per cent.

First Bank of Nigeria (FBN) Holding shares rose by 2.27 per cent, MTN Nigeria shares rose to 1.56 per cent. Conversely, while the shares of Unilever declined by 4.01 per cent and Ecobank fell by 1.27 per cent.

On the money market, inter-bank lending rate rose with the overnight (O/N) rate increasing by 0.08 per cent compared with the 7.08 per cent and the 7.00 per cent it closed with the previous day.

Also, the Open Repo (OPR) decreased by 0.33 per cent to close at 6.33 per cent compared with the previous day, which closed at 6.63 per cent.

At the Import and Export (I&E) window, the naira depreciated by 0.12 per cent as the dollar was quoted at N420.25 as against the previous day, when it closed at N419.75.

Oando partners Lagos on electric mass transit, targets 22m commuters

Oando Clean Energy Limited (OCEL) has partnered the Lagos State Government to roll out electric mass transit buses in its efforts to support charging infrastructure and service centers (EV Infrastructure Ecosystem).

Oando had signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Lagos Metropolitan Area Transport Authority (LAMATA), the agency tasked with planning, implementing, regulating and engaging franchises for sustainable integrated public transportation system on April 28 2022 to revolutionise public mass transit in the state.

The partnership will form part of several interventions, such as the Lagos Blue and Red Rail, expected to set the tone for the gradual decarbonisation of the state's road transportation sector.

Commenting on the MoU, Managing Director of LAMATA, Abimbola Akinajo, said: "Oando Clean Energy approached us with a comprehensive solution that went beyond electric mass transit buses to include supporting infrastructure and this was key for us, as the full remit of an EV support ecosystem is the only way to achieve success.

"This initiative will not only accelerate the state government's transportation agenda, but also positively impact the health of Lagos residents and the entire environment.

"The Oando brand comes with know-how and experience and we are relying on this to successfully move from the signing of the MoU to actual implementation that will in the medium to long-term benefit over 22 million Lagos commuters. We look forward to a robust and fruitful partnership."

He said the initiative reinforces the importance of Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) in enabling the continent to actualise its industrialisation goals, adding that across Africa, PPP models have become increasingly critical as both funding and operational mechanism for socio-economic infrastructure.

"This is not the first time Oando has partnered with the state government, neither is it the first time it has created a blueprint for others to adopt in the realm of cleaner energy solutions.

"In the past, through its erstwhile mid-stream vehicle, Oando Gas and Power (OGP), now rebranded as Axxela, any pioneered private sector gas pipeline development in 2007 and championed the development of Independent Power Plants (IPPs) including the Akute and Alausa IPPs powering the Lagos Water Cooperation and the Lagos State Secretariat," he stated.

Also, the state Commissioner for Transport, Dr. Fred Oladeyinde, said with the understanding that transportation was a key emitter of greenhouse gases in Nigeria, the state developed a strategy to cut greenhouse gases by 50 per cent.

"A key component of this strategy was identifying and developing a more robust mass transit system for Lagos that would include rail and waterways among others. Using electricity to power mass transit is a step in the right direction and from there we will gradually transit to private cars.

"This is just the beginning, there is still a lot more to come on stream. I commend LAMATA and Oando on the signing of the MoU and both parties can be rest assured that they have my full backing to ensure the success of the initiative," he added.

Conflict among concessionaires may cripple \$3.2b e-Customs project

With over two years of the Federal Executive Council's (FEC) approval for the Nigeria Customs Service (NCS) e-Customs project, indications have emerged that conflict among the concessionaires may cripple the \$3.2 billion contract already signed by the Federal Government.

This is coming as the initial lead concessionaire, Bionica Technology, said it had not exited the contract, contrary to the reports of the Minister of Finance, Mrs. Zainab Ahmed that the company earlier pulled out of the scheme following disagreement in the sharing formula of the project.

Findings also revealed that Bionica is considering litigation that could see the project delayed indefinitely, even as the company is concluding plans for

a media briefing to unveil some un-procedural approaches by the Finance Ministry in the contract.

The Trumpet recalled that the Finance Minister, had last week, said the implementation of the e-Customs project would now commence since the party that was uncomfortable with the agreement had opted out, despite efforts by the government, through the office of the Attorney General of the Federation, AGF, to mediate.

An official of Bionica, Umaru Tanko, challenged the Minister of Finance to provide documents indicating that the company pulled out of the concession arrangement.

While confirming that the company had disagreed with other partners in the concession, he argued that the Ministry of Finance facilitated the concession

in violation of known regulations and procedures.

His words: "I really don't want to comment on this now, because we are still weighing the best approach on the matter. Shortly, we will reach out to the press and provide documents and evidence of what happened with the e-Customs project.

"The procedure was affected and there are obvious irregularities that the Federal Government has to correct, hence, this project will certainly suffer some setbacks."

When asked if the disagreement in the concession was linked to the pulling out of one of the concessionaires (Bionica), he said, "Where is the proof that any of the concessionaires pulled out? The Finance Minister didn't provide any document to show that any of the concessionaires pulled out.

"There is no evidence that any concessionaire pulled out and the concessionaire we are talking about is the lead sponsor and promoter of the project. Bionica developed the project and without Bionica the government is handing over the business to mere facilitators."

Meanwhile, industry stakeholders have continued to oppose the e-Customs project, describing it as a confirmation that the NCS had been relegated to only a revenue collection agency with concessionaires projecting \$176 billion government revenue in 20 years at the expense of trade facilitation and national security.

Some freight forwarders had also raised concerns on the secrecy surrounding the contract, even as they lamented the absence of stakeholders' engagement in the exercise.

Industry observers have also faulted the Federal Government's recent investments in scanners amid plans to concession that aspect of the service the FEC

approved in 2021.

The contract sum of \$18.12 million and N3.255 million for the acquisition of three Rapiscan Cargo Mobile Scanners awarded to Messrs Airwave Limited and another contract of N280 million, including Value Added Tax (VAT) for five units of fast Ballistic Reverie Assault Boats/ five units of Patrol Boats with assorted accessories awarded to Messrs C.Y. West Africa Limited.

With these scanners already deployed to the Tin Can Island, Apapa and Onne ports, industry stakeholders have described the move as a waste of resources.

Also in a bid to dissipate the backlash, which has trailed the Customs concession, the NCS Spokesman, Timi Bomodi, encouraged stakeholders to support the initiative, as it would enhance Customs operations for imports and exports.

"As efficient as NICIS II is, it still has limitations. We complain about alerts and serial interventions on transactions because we have a less than efficient audit mechanism.

"With this system examinations and release of import and exports will be subjected to live feeds in multiple platforms. This will check arbitrary decision making at all levels and will guide interventions.

"Several aspects of the Customs job are still not automated. An example is the escort operations for goods in transit. Today, because of shortfall in manpower, requests for escort takes quite a while before approval. This causes delays in the delivery of transit containers, but with automated e-tracking system, the delays will be a thing of the past," he said.

Bomodi also assured that border management and control, as well as interface with other government agencies will be enhanced as customs moves into an era of high efficiency, which will be tech-driven.

Commercial buses take over okada operations at Apapa port corridor

Commercial buses have resurfaced along the newly constructed Apapa Oshodi Expressway, with passengers plying the Mile 2-Liverpool axis along Tin Can Island Port corridor.

The Trumpet, which monitored

the development since the Lagos State Government's ban of motorcycles on Wednesday, June 1, 2022, reports that a section of the road has been occupied by yellow buses (Danfo), mini buses and LT buses, which usually carries higher number of passengers.

The outward Apapa lane of

the road under construction is currently occupied by tankers and container-laden trucks and although Okada riders were relatively visible along the corridor, commercial buses far outnumbered them.

Viable routes along the corridor by the transporters include the Mile 2-Second Gate Tin Can

Island Port, Mile 2-Coconut, Mile 2-Liverpool and Mile 2-First Gate.

A cross section of commuters who spoke with *The Trumpet* expressed sigh of relief over the development, even as they commended efforts of the transporters' initiative at assisting passengers.

They noted that the transporters' initiative was timely, sequel to the recent ban of Okada in some part of Lagos State.

A customs broker, who simply identified himself as Sunday Nwachukwu, noted that the replacement of commercial buses with Okada along the corridor was a welcome development, adding that it is safer, cheaper and less risky.

Nwachukwu said the transporters have provided assistance for most of the freight forwarders and other ancillary service providers in the shipping industry, pointing out that the ban of motorbike operators from major highways should be properly

enforced and implemented.

On her part, Comrade Bolanle Adewole of the Nigeria Merchant Navy Officer and Water Transport Senior Association, applauded the Lagos State Governor, Babajide Sanwo-Olu for the ban on okada, adding that the transport hiccups in Apapa have been addressed with the intervention of commercial buses.

Adewole stated that issues of transportation within the corridors would reduce the risk of accidents.

Another stakeholder in the maritime industry, Jerry Obadiah, called on road transport unions to ensure that motorbike operators should not be allowed to venture into commercial bus business for now.

Obadiah maintained that the era of going round within the Apapa-Ajegunle axis will become a thing of the past if relevant agencies properly carry out enforcement of the ban.

Nigeria Air gets license for proposed national carrier amid pending aircraft

The Nigerian Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA) has issued an Air Transport License (ATL) to Nigeria Air Limited the operating company for the new national carrier Nigeria Air.

Minister of Aviation, Hadi Sirika, said the licencing was the beginning of operations of the airline, maintaining that the commencement date for the domestic operation of the airline would be announced in due course.

Nigeria Air Limited received an Air Transport License (ATL) from the Nigerian Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA) signaling the end of the beginning of operations of the airline and the commencement date of domestic operations will be announced in due course," Sirika wrote on his verified Twitter handle.

The Trumpet learnt from an employee of NCAA that the Federal Government has begun the process of buying and leasing some aircraft.

The source added that the airline hope to commence operations before the year runs out with about eight to 10 aircrafts depending on the outcome of the commitments of its private partners.

The source who spoke on condition of anonymity said the airline would have begun operations a long time ago, but for the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic.

He added that the President Muhammadu Buhari administration wants to see that the airline project become a reality before the end of its tenure, which is less than a year.

The Trumpet recalled that Air Nigeria takes off has been dogged with several challenges, setbacks and controversies in the last four and five years.

The ATL marked: NCAA/ATR1/ATL214, which was presented to the airline, was signed by the Director-General of NCAA, Captain Musa Nuhu, and would run for five years from June 3, 2022 to June 2, 2027. The new national airline is expected to provide scheduled and non-scheduled services.

It would be recalled that Nigeria Air Limited had in March, 2022 applied to the NCAA for a license to operate scheduled and non-scheduled passenger and cargo service.

Meanwhile, the interim management of the national carrier has explained why the new airline was yet to take delivery of any aircraft required for its operations.

Speaking in Lagos after receiving an ATL for Nigeria Air, the Chief Executive of the airline, Captain Dapo Olumide, who stressed that it was difficult to get the aircraft, attributed this to the effect of the COVID-19 pandemic on the global aviation sector and other factors.

Olumide, who received the licence on behalf of the proposed new airline, assured that efforts were ongoing to get all the aircraft, as this was a basic requirement of the NCAA before the issuance of another vital certificate.

"The aircrafts are available but there are all sorts of issues because this is summer peak period. And as you know, post-COVID, all the aircraft were parked in the desert. The airlines are bringing them out slowly. It takes time to

bring an aircraft out of storage. There is a further complication with lots of flights in Europe are being cancelled or delayed because most people were laid off during the COVID and they don't have enough staff in the airports to turn around flights.

"It is difficult to get the aircraft but, we there are ongoing discussions with the original equipment manufacturers and we are waiting for the right terms of the agreement. We already have the aircraft identified, because that is one of the requirements of NCAA, but we are just trying to perfect titles and so on," he said.

Olumide also noted that the airline was still sourcing aircraft, stressing that the national carrier was in a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) process with the Infrastructure Concession Regulatory Commission (ICRC) based on approval of the Federal Executive Council (FEC).

Nine years after ratification, stakeholders decry NIMASA's poor regulation of MLC

Industry stakeholders have expressed worries over the lack of proper enforcement, implementation and regulations of the Maritime Labour Convention (MLC) 2006 by the Nigerian Maritime Administration and Safety Agency (NIMASA) nine years after ratification of the convention in 2013.

They lamented that manning agents and ship owners are uncontrollable in term of employment and working condition of seafarers aboard ships, while calling on government to review and revise the convention.

A Director of the Centre for Multi-Modal Transport Studies, University of Lagos (UNILAG), Iyiola Oni, decried failure of enforcement and regulations of the MLC in Nigeria since its ratification almost a decade ago.

In a presentation, the university teacher also lamented that the workers right convention had failed to adequately address most of the pressing issues in the nation's maritime space.

Oni maintained that the MLC 2006 was yet to bring about the anticipated changes due to difficulty in implementation by different ratifying flag states.

According to him, regulatory agencies of the Convention in Nigeria failed to effectively regulate manning agents and recruitment of seafarers aboard ships in the maritime domain.

He also added that ship owners and their agents do not properly provide rest hours, feeding and quality of recreation facilities.

He further stressed the need for the government to review and revise the MLC 2006, pointing out that Article IV of the Convention provides right to secure and safe working environment, fair terms of employment, decent working

and living conditions on board ships.

Oni restated that health protection, medical care, welfare measures and other social protection measures were major components that were itemised in MLC 2006.

The lecturer asked NIMASA to collaborate with other relevant authorities to effectively enforce and regulate manning activities in the country, maintaining that adequate welfare of seafarers would move global trade without barrier.

"Seafarers are the drivers of the transformation to a low carbon maritime industry. To attain a low carbon maritime industry, it is vital that working condition, health and safety of seafarers are guaranteed.

"Stronger standards are required for safe operational crew and component crew resilience which reduced risk to crew, vessels and the environment.

"The transition maritime task force set up in 2022 made up of the UN's shipping body, IMO and International Labour Organisation (ILO) targets ensuring that the shipping industry pursues a fair and equitable green transition in shipping," he added.

Seafarers' unions have also called on the apex regulatory agency to up the ante in furtherance to better the lots of seafarers.

MLC 2006 came into force in August 2013 with the aim of ensuring better working and living condition of seafarers. Currently, no fewer than 96 countries of the world have ratified the provisions of the conference covering 90 per cent of global shipping fleet.

Nigeria is the 37th ILO member state and fifth state in the Africa region to have ratified the provisions of the conference in 2013.

MWUN tasks NPA on renewal of concession agreement with indigenous terminal operators

Maritime Workers Union of Nigeria (MWUN) has urged the Nigerian Ports Authority (NPA) to encourage indigenous terminal operators in the country's ports by renewing their concession agreements.

President General of MWUN, Adewale Adeganju, who gave the charge while addressing journalists in Lagos, asked the Managing Director of NPA, Muhammed Bello-Koko to expedite action on the renewal of the concession agreements.

Adeganju argued that unlike the foreign terminal operators, whose activities and investments translate into capital flight, indigenous terminals had encouraged Nigerian workers better.

It would be recalled that the Managing Director of NPA, at a parley with the maritime journalists recently disclosed that the concession of no fewer

than five terminal operators had expired and that the agency was on the verge of renewing them without new conditions.

While making a case for the indigenous terminals, Adeganju also urged the NPA to give them more favourable terms of agreement than their foreign counterparts, who care less about Nigerians and the country's economy.

"Our indigenous terminal operators need to be supported, because they have done well. We all know what transpired in 2016, when they were coming onboard, we thought that they will not perform, but now, we have seen the dividends of privatising the ports one of which is that it has generated employment.

"What happened there was that for the NPA, which happens to be the master stevedore then, privatising the ports affected all 14,000 employees of the NPA,

which was reduced to 3,000 workers.

"But as things went on, we have been able to manage the terminal operators. We need to encourage them to improve on their terminals. I agree that some of them are not good, but to me, they have come to stay, anyone found wanting among them should have their contract of concession reviewed," he said.

Adeganju also pointed out that indigenous terminal operators should be applauded, as most of the foreign terminal operators at the port and other multinational companies invest in Nigeria and make huge profits, which they repatriate to their countries for development.

He said this calls for encouragement of indigenous terminals by the government to ensure money made from Nigeria is reinvested for the development of the country.

No comparison in industry, says Saidi Balogun

Veteran Nollywood actor, Saidi Balogun is one of the most versatile ones who combines acting, producing and directing. There is no comparison so to say; we are all under one umbrella tagged 'Nollywood'.

Your new movie *Online* is currently doing well. What is the inspiration behind the movie?

Like I always say, I am in the era of rebranding myself and on that note was when I shot the movie 'Online'. With the movie I try as much as possible to make a lot of youths especially know that they can't always get away with anything they post online because nobody seems to be censoring their contents. The movie

is also to generally erase the notion that only criminal stuffs are done online.

You double as the Director of Media for Adron Homes; does that mean you are turning back on acting?

Turning my back on acting? That is never going to happen. Let me state it here clearly that my deal with Adron will not affect my job as an actor and movie producer. Back then when the company contacted me, I took my time to study the brand and discovered that they worthy companies and also I discovered that the only common thing that gives many Nigerians problem is the issue of housing. So, if a company is giving Nigerians the opportunity to become land and house owners in the most simplest and affordable way, I think it should be commended.

I understand what my job entails as the director of media, and I am ready giving my best.

Lola Idije was always providing money for me any time I had issues at School. They have been calling me Jide Kosoko's boy and I remain his boy.

NFF General Secretary, Dr Mohammed Sanusi said in Abuja on Tuesday that the situation is a consequence of the one-match ban placed on the country by world football governing body, FIFA, over the fracas that followed the end of 2022 FIFA World Cup playoff round against the Black Stars of Ghana in March.

"We want to appeal to our very passionate football fans to



take heart for this one game. It is only a one-match ban, after which they can again start trooping out to support the Super Eagles," Sanusi said.

"The match against Sierra Leone will be without fans as a consequence of what happened after the match against the Ghanaians.

"Nonetheless, we want to urge all our football fans,

and indeed all Nigerians, to support the team whichever way they can and pray for success against the Sierra Leoneans on Thursday," he appealed.

The Super Eagles take on the Leone Stars at the MKO Abiola National Stadium, Abuja in a Day 1 game of the 2023 Africa Cup of Nations starting from 5pm on Thursday, 9th June.

Four days later, they tackle 'The Falcons and True Parrots' of São Tomé and Príncipe at the 45,000-capacity Grand Stade de Agadir in southern Morocco.

While CAF has appointed Ivorian officials to take charge of the encounter in Abuja, Liberian officials led by referee Hassen Corneh will oversee the match in Agadir on Monday.

AYG2022: Nigeria, Benin qualify for beach volleyball

Nigeria volleyball youth team and their counterpart, Benin Republic, have qualified to represent their countries in beach volleyball at the 2022 African Youth Games.

The giant of Africa's team, during qualification, beat Niger Republic in two sets, 21-13, 22-20 to record a 2-0 victory in the male category to complement their unbeaten run at the just concluded 2022 Zone III African Youth Games (AYG) Qualification Beach Volleyball held at Mobebe Palace, Badagry, Lagos state.

In another scenario, Nigeria in the female category, walloped Benin Republic on two occasions being the only female team in be 2022 ZIII AYG qualifiers, 2-0 (21-14, 21-11) and 2-0 (21-8, 21-8) to garner 8 points to qualify for African Youth Games championship.

top with 12 points followed by Benin Republic in second place with 9 points. Niger Republic placed third with 6 points while Ivory Coast occupied the fourth position with 3 points.

According to the report by the Nigeria Volleyball Federation (NVBF), the Secretary-General of Confederation of African Volleyball (CAVB) Zone III, Engineer Musa Nimrod commended the participating teams for making qualification a success.

He hailed the Mobebe of Badagry for providing the beach volleyball facilities and crowd support base during the qualifiers.

Nimrod, who is the President of Nigeria Volleyball Federation said, "The 2022 Zone III African Youth Games Qualification Beach Volleyball was successful and I want to thank the Mobebe of Badagry



for providing the facilities and the people of Badagry are great; CAVB Zone III executives want to thank the countries that participated.

"It is not a surprise that Nigeria qualified for the African Youth Games and we will put in a lot of effort because the real games are not easy.

"The coaches have seen the weaknesses of the players; the Federation will begin the Beach Tour in July and it

will strengthen the players," Nimrod revealed.

He added that the participants are good representatives of beach volleyball sport and specifically thank Cote d'Ivoire for making up to the qualifying stage.

He continued: "Benin, Nigeria and Niger Republic are good in Beach Volleyball as far as I am concerned; I want to thank Ivory Coast for making it to the qualifiers.

Cannavaro wants English, Spanish clubs' offers

Azzurri legend Fabio Cannavaro longs to return to coaching after parting ways with Chinese topflight club Tianjin in 2021.

The 2006 World Cup-winning star voted the '2006 FIFA Footballer of the Year', disclosed that he has spoken to several clubs in England and Spain to get back to coaching.

However, Cannavaro, commenting on Ivan Perisic's move to Tottenham from Inter Milan, noted that it poses a threat to the Italian league which lags behind the English Premier League and Spanish

La Liga.

Furthermore, the former Tianjin boss pointed out that Paul Pogba's prospective move back to Juventus is a welcome development but hopes that the France World Cup-winning star can replicate his old form which attracted Manchester United to resign him at a club-record fee.

According to a report by La Gazzetta dello Sport, Cannavaro said, "I want to return to the pitch, but I am in no rush.

"I've spoken to several

clubs in England and Spain, but I must be convinced about the decision. It's not a matter of money, but I must feel the ambition to reach specific targets.

"It's complicated for Serie A sides to fill the gap with La Liga and Premier League clubs.

"Perisic's move to the Premier League isn't a good sign," he opined.

Speaking about Pogba, he continued: "I hope we'll see the real Pogba again, one of his first spells at Juventus.

"He needs to find the right

motivations because the midfielder we've seen in the last few seasons isn't useful to Juventus or France," added the Italian legend.

Cannavaro, nevertheless, defended coach Gennaro Gattuso who was accused by some Valencia fans of racism.

In his defence, he exemplified Gattuso who he acknowledged as a good coach that has impressive records.

He added that he is aware that the directors at Valencia are having some issues among themselves, the kind once experienced by Tottenham

French Open champion Rafael Nadal said he will feature in this year's Wimbledon if his chronic football injury subsides.

The 22 Grand Slam single titles holder has been suffering from a chronic foot injury that forced him out of several major contests in 2021.

Though the 36-year-old expected to have retired because of the incident that needs urgent medical surgery, the Spaniard has played through 2022 using anaesthetic injections to suppress the pains and has won two majors.

Nadal's accolades presently have surpassed world number 1 Novak Djokovic and Roger Federer's Grand Slam singles titles record by two after he won the 2022 Australian Open and French Open at Court Philippe Chatrier.

But the Spaniard, who is eager to feature in the Wimbledon, has rejected any means of undergoing a process of playing through the support of anaesthetic injections.

"Wimbledon is a priority, always has been a priority. If I'm able to play with anti-inflammatories yes," Nadal said told Sky Sports

"To play with anaesthetic injections, I do not want to put myself in that position again. It can happen once but no, it's not the philosophy of life I want to follow.

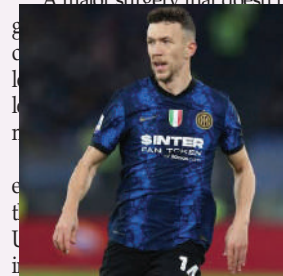
"Let's see. I am always a positive guy and always expect things are going the right way. Let's be confident, let's be positive and let's see what's going on," he added.

Confirming the report, Liverpool on their official social media handle said, "The vice-captain, who joined the club in 2015, is set to remain with the Reds for a further season having agreed to fresh terms beyond the expiry of his previous deal this summer.

"Since arriving on a free transfer seven years ago, the No.7 has helped Jürgen Klopp's team win the Premier League, Champions League, FIFA Club World Cup, UEFA Super Cup and, last season, the Emirates FA Cup and Carabao Cup.

"Milner has played 289 games, the most of any side he has represented in his career, and scored 26 goals during his time at Anfield so far," Liverpool added.

Milner, overwhelmed with the contract extension, has been a stabilising force on Liverpool's bench, giving Klopp an option in games that prove physically tenses.

"Couldn't be happier to extend my stay with this incredible club for another year. Playing football is a privilege and even more so here. Thanks for the support, will do my best to repay it," Milner said after completing the deal.

The former Three Lions midfielder capped 61 times with a goal to his name, got his first call to represent England in 2009.

"Blessing Etim will lead the team as captain, supported by Favour Esiegbe as her vice, Esther Sandy returns to the squad after falling short in the Nigeria Women's Invitational Tournament earlier this year in Lagos, Rukayat Abdulrasaq makes her debut for the country to complete the quartet from

Kwara State," he added.

Furthermore, Musa clarified that one of the promising top cricketers unavoidably absent for selection was substituted with debutant Sarah Etim.

He said, "Batting prodigy Lucky Piety is unavailable due to studies which also provided the opportunity for another new entrant to the team in the person of Sarah Etim."

Nigeria open her encounter in the tournament against Brazil on the 9th of June 2022 at the Gahanga International Cricket Stadium in the afternoon fixtures scheduled for 1:30 pm.

Wales qualify in second World Cup after 1958

Wales have qualified to feature in the World Cup finals in Qatar after they defeated embattled Ukrainians 1-0 to clinch the golden opportunity since 1958.

In a tumultuous journey to see Ryan Giggs' side gifted an own-goal by Ukraine's Andriy Yarmolenko at the Cardiff City Stadium, complimented their renaissance to feature in the global football event after their first appearance in the 1958 World Cup in Sweden.

Wales formerly 117 in the world ranking, staged a renaissance when Gareth Bale broke into the ranks of football

greats and succeeded in featuring for the first time in the UEFA European championship in 2016 where they recorded their best-ever result by reaching the semifinals.

The team, propelled by the success in the 2016 UEFA EURO hosted by France, qualified for the successive 2020 edition where they were eliminated in the round of 16.

Prior to the final qualifying playoff with Ukraine, Bale, whose nine years reign at Real Madrid ended last week and has bid the club a farewell, stressed that his focus was on the deciding cracker to feature in the World Cup

finals in Qatar.

However, the player who will seek to continue his career elsewhere after a scintillating spell with Los Blancos, accepted that the journey to clinch the World Cup ticket to Qatar was crazy.

"It's been a crazy journey from where we were to qualify for two European Championships and a World Cup," elated Bale told the media post-match.

"It's literally what dreams are made of, especially for all of us who have been there from the start. We've paved the way for the youngsters as well, we've welcomed them in and it's hard to describe

what it means to us.

"I think we were too young (to have targets) when we started. We were just happy playing for Wales. You just get better and you grow. Players become bigger and stronger and we've gelled well as a team. There's no ego in our team, we just fight for each other," he added.

Wales presently ranked 18 in the world, will on Wednesday, June 8, 2022, entertain Netherlands in the UEFA Nations League and Belgium on Saturday, June 11, in the third before they head to De Klup Stadium to take on Netherlands on Tuesday, June 14.

FIVB open bids for 2023 World Age Championship

■ CAVB to reschedule qualifiers' event

Following the decision by the International Volleyball Federation (FIVB) to open the bidding process for nations to host the Volleyball Age Group World Championships 2023, the Confederations of African Volleyball (CAVB) have reopened applications for the 2022 CAVB Age Group Competition.

FIVB noted that the timeframe for the bidding process spans from 1 July to 31 August 2023.

In a statement, the world volleyball governing body stated that the sport has gained so much prominence among volleyball loving countries to the level that it resulted in the higher viewership in the 2021 event.

FIVB also realigned the category for the world event in 2023 to Girls' U19, Boys' U19, Women's U21 and Men's U21 Volleyball World Championships.

"The Age Group Volleyball World Championships are important for the development of athletes and their sports careers as they provide opportunities to experience international competitions," FIVB President Dr Ary Graça said.

"These events also allow for new and developing nations to host major FIVB events and bring incredible volleyball action to their communities.

"With quality TV production taken care of by the FIVB, we have been pleased with interest from fans in the age-group competitions across the previous editions of the events.

"We will continue to invest in these events to showcase the best of our sport's rising stars," he added.

Accordingly, CAVB realigning and readjusting the age category of the competitors to meet the FIVB amendments, stressed that the approved categories' birth dates should be on or after 1 January 2005 for Under 19 while the Under 21's spotted on or after 1 January 2003.

CAVB disclosed that the 2022 African Youth Games (AYG), which had been slated for 26th August to 6th September 2022 in Cairo, Egypt, to determine the qualifiers to the FIVB 2023 World Championships for Youth Boys and Girls, may be moved to a later date and venue.

"This, therefore, means that all the Zonal Qualifiers for the 2022 African Youth Games may have to be delayed until a new host and dates for the Youth Games are determined," CAVB said.

"Given these developments, CAVB has reopened and hereby invites National Federations that are interested in hosting any or several of the Age Group Competitions, to express their interest by filling in and sending the attached Application Forms to CAVB by 6th July 2022.

"We will appreciate it if interested National Federations indicated the proposed dates between August and November 2022 during which they find suitable to host the event(s), while taking into consideration that we shall need between nine (9) and thirteen (13) days for each event.

"The actual competition days will eventually be determined based on the number of teams that will register for the respective events," the statement added.

Can Plateau United hope cum reality?

Rivers United suffered a defeat in Bauchi to cut their lead over title arch-rivals Plateau United, who narrowly secured a slim win over Kano Pillars in Jos on Sunday.

How Boris Johnson survived no-confidence vote, sack

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson won a “no-confidence” vote on Monday evening and will remain in office after lawmakers from his Conservative political party voted in favor of his leadership by a margin of 211 to 148.

The vote could have forced his resignation after the prime minister became involved in a series of scandals.

The prime minister needed a simple majority of the 359 Conservative

members of Parliament to vote in his favor. He won that with 211 supporting him and 148 voting against him.

The no-confidence vote comes after months of pressure building on Johnson’s leadership, and this is the first vote of its kind since Johnson became prime minister in 2019.

A vote of no confidence in the Conservative Party is triggered if the party’s leaders receive letters of request from at least 15% of sitting Conservative members of Parliament.

The prime minister was fined by the Metropolitan Police in April for breaking

the law. He and his colleagues held and attended parties during the height of COVID-19 lockdowns in 2020, becoming the first sitting prime minister in British history to receive a sanction for breaking the law.

It was revealed that government officials were having wine and cheese in Johnson’s official residence at Number 10 Downing Street, it was all caught in photographs while members of the public were prevented from visiting dying relatives under COVID-19 restrictions they had devised sparked mass outrage.

The report included a photo of the prime minister making a toast at a gathering held in No. 10 to mark the departure of one of his special advisers, at a time when the nation was under a strict lockdown.

Johnson has apologized but his popularity has dropped in recent months, he has since faced calls to resign from opposition lawmakers and also members of his own party.

The prime minister of the United Kingdom is not directly elected to serve in the role, but appointed by the political party that

wins the majority of seats in Parliament. If Johnson had lost the vote on Monday, the Conservative Party, which holds the majority, would have automatically taken over as prime minister.

British geologist jailed in Iraq for smuggling artefacts

In a case that has attracted international attention, a British citizen has been sentenced by an Iraqi court to 15 years in prison on charges of attempting to smuggle artifacts out of the country.

The verdict handed down to retired geologist Jim Fitton, shocked the court in Baghdad, including his defense attorney. He and his family have argued that 66-year-old Fitton had no criminal intent.

A German national tried with Fitton, Volker Waldmann, was found not to have criminal intent in the case and will be released.

“I thought the worst-case scenario would be one year, with suspension,” Fitton’s lawyer, Thair Soud, said, visibly shocked.

Judge Jabir Abd Jabir found that by picking up the artefacts, which were dated as older than 200 years according to a technical government investigation, and intending to transport

them out of the country, Fitton had criminal intent to smuggle them.

The judge did not consider Soud’s arguments that laid out Fitton’s ignorance of Iraqi laws and the value of the items he had picked up.

Fitton and Waldmann were arrested at Baghdad

airport on March 20 after airport security discovered the items in their luggage. They had been part of a tourism expedition across the country’s ancient sites.

Twelve fragments of pottery and other shards were found in Fitton’s possession by Iraqi

authorities, all of them collected as souvenirs, Fitton’s family says, during a group tourism expedition to Eridu, an ancient Mesopotamian site in what is now Dhi Qar province.

Waldmann’s defence team had said that the German tourist had been carrying the

pieces for Fitton, but that he did not pick them up from the site.

Both men were charged with smuggling based on the country’s antiquities laws, which potentially could have been punished by the death penalty. However, officials had said that was only a

remote possibility.

Fitton’s lawyer said he intends to appeal Fitton’s sentence immediately. It is not clear if Fitton will be able to serve his sentence in his home country, which is a possibility due to a prisoner transfer treaty between Iraq and the United Kingdom.

S’West govts get ultimatum to avert further massacres, acts of terrorism

Following the terror attack at St. Francis Catholic Church in Owo, Owo Local Government on Sunday, leaders of thought in Yorubaland have declared and made seven points demands for South-West governors to avert further attacks. The leaders in a statement, asked South-West Governors to immediately embark on an “operation sweep terrorism out of Yorubaland” to be led by their Chairman and Ondo State Governor, Oluwarotimi Akeredolu, being the latest victim of terrorism attack.

In the statement signed by Otunba Deji Osibogun and Engr. Yomi Bolarinwa, the leaders expressed worry over the inability of security agencies to nip all

the insecurity occurrences in the country and why many of the herders who are Fulani terrorists (whether real or disguised), have not been apprehended or prosecuted. The statement added that operation sweep terrorism out of Yorubaland must not stop at their arrests, but must also proceed towards the diligent prosecution of their cases which ordinarily attracts death penalty for their murderous activities. The statement read in part: “No culprit once apprehended must be transferred to Abuja where often times they are never tried but released to embark again on their aborted missions. All cases must be tried and prosecuted in Yorubaland where the crimes are committed.”

Furthermore, the leaders advised the governors to temporarily ban motorcycles (Okada) for the next 10 months, in order for the

state governments to establish appropriate regulations for its operations or pass laws for its total ban. Also, the statement added that each State Security Councils in conjunction with all local governments council areas should commence an immediate residency registration programme of all security personnel in each state. The leaders asked each state government to establish a law or an edict for compulsory registration of neighbourhood associations, and collaborate with the Police Community Relations associations in each Divisional Police Headquarters.

“Similarly, security outfits operating across all the 137+19 LGs in SW including Kogi(12), Kwara(5) and Edo(2) must be registered. In this regard, the Governors of Kogi and Kwara

must be co-opted to avoid a breach of security or loopholes from their areas.

“The proposed OPERATION SWEEP TERRORISM OUT OF YORUBALAND must be coordinated in conjunction with Amotekun, OPC, Agbekoya, Yoruba Hunters Association and our farmers union. A thirty day(30) period of evaluation and implementation of these 7 point demands is hereby proposed to the governors so they can be implemented on behalf of innocent Yoruba sons and daughters who now live in daily fear and those in diaspora who are too scared to return home.”

The leaders said any further massacre in Yorubaland as a result of non-implementation of the seven demands must be squarely blamed on the governors.
